

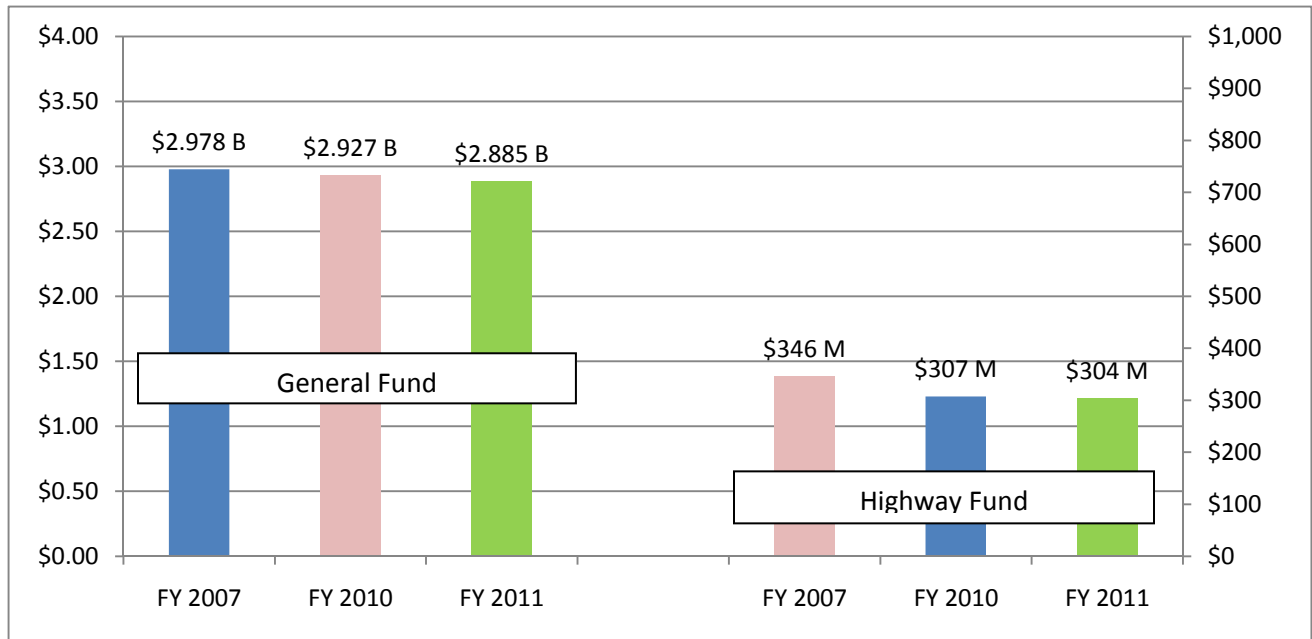
## State Budgets: Then and Now

TABOR I appeared on the ballot in November, 2006 – the middle of Fiscal Year 2006-07. For that fiscal year, the state’s General Fund Budget stood at \$2.978 Billion.

Three years later...TABOR II will appear on the ballot in November, 2009 - the middle of Fiscal Year 2009-2010. This budget year, the state’s General Fund Budget is \$2.927 Billion which is \$51 million less than *three years ago*.

If TABOR II were to pass, it would first impact the FY 2011 budget. The current budgeted appropriation for FY 2011 is \$90 million less than the FY 2007 budget. Plus, both FY 2010 and FY 2011 budgets are being supported by one-time sources of revenue such as the “rainy day” fund and federal “stimulus” money. These revenue sources will not be available in 2012.

The state’s Highway Fund Budget is also significantly lower (11%) than it was three years ago when TABOR was first proposed (and rejected).
