

Position Established via Poll & Zoom Meetings

Below are the positions the LPC established via the use of polls and impromptu Zoom meetings, which were necessary due to the scheduling of public hearings. Since these positions were created without the benefit of a full LPC debate, on Thursday members will be asked if they would like to reconsider any of the established positions.

To do so, when the chair presents the consent agenda for approval, members will be asked to remove items from the agenda, if any. As an example, if a member objects or has a question with respect to the opposed position established on LD 461, then that member would ask that LD 461 be removed from the consent agenda. Once members have had the opportunity to remove items, what remains on the list will be adopted in a single motion and then the chair will open the discussion on the removed bills and call for a motion for each bill.

There are two bills that staff have removed from the consent agenda because the polling results were inconclusive and require additional LPC feedback.
